Many programs offer opportunities for international exposure through exchange programs.








Approaching Applications for Liberal Education

Understand the Prompt

- Carefully analyze the essay prompt or question.
- Identify key themes or values the institution seeks, such as critical thinking, collaboration, innovation, or diversity.
- Tailor your response to reflect these values while staying authentic.



Demonstrate Fit with the Institution

- Research the college's philosophy, curriculum, and community. How does it align with your goals?
- Mention specific programs, professors, or campus initiatives that excite you and why.



Be Authentic and Personal

- Share your story. Liberal education values individuality—your unique experiences, perspectives, and aspirations matter.
- Highlight moments of intellectual curiosity, creativity, or personal growth that shaped your outlook.



Craft a Strong Opening

- Begin with an anecdote, question, or insight that immediately grabs attention.
- Use the introduction to set the tone and establish your essay's core theme.



Showcase Intellectual Curiosity

- Discuss ideas or questions that fascinate you. How have you explored these interests?
- Connect your academic passions with broader societal issues or interdisciplinary fields.



Show Rather Than Tell

- Use specific examples and anecdotes to illustrate your points.
- Instead of saying, "I am curious about history," narrate how a historical debate or artifact sparked your interest.





Emphasize Reflection

- Explain the "why" behind your experiences and choices.
- Reflect on lessons learned, values gained, and how they have influenced your path.



Maintain a Balanced Tone

- Be confident but not arrogant.
- Avoid being overly casual; strike a tone that reflects maturity and self-awareness.



Edit and Refine

- Write multiple drafts. The first draft is just the beginning.
- Seek feedback from mentors, peers, or counsellors who understand your goals.
- Pay attention to grammar, syntax, and clarity—your writing reflects your thinking.



Stay Within the Word Limit

- Adhere to the word count without compromising content.
- Be concise but ensure your voice and story shine through.





Aptitude Tests

Some institutions require aptitude tests to assess logical reasoning, verbal and quantitative aptitude, and data interpretation. Examples include:



Online 90-minute test with MCQs, followed by a 30-minute essay.



FEAT with sections like Verbal Ability, Reasoning, Quantitative Ability, and General Knowledge.

Interviews often explore:



Your motivations for choosing liberal education.



Specific interests, such as books you read, hobbies, or subject preferences.



Real-world awareness, such as news or societal trends.



Personal traits, strengths, and areas for improvement.




Ashoka University


